RE: Opportunity to Comment on Draft Leksell Gamma Knife Perfexion and Leksell Gamma Knife Icon Licensing Guidance (RCPD-16-003)

The Organization of Agreement States (OAS) Executive Board (Board) has reviewed the above document and respectfully submits the following comments on the proposed draft guidance.

1. On page 4, the AMP requirements for the Icon indicate that before July 1, 2016 an AMP has to demonstrate training, but after July 1, 2019 a preceptor attestation can be used. The Board recommends correcting the first date to July 1, 2019.
2. The written directive commitment and "high confidence" commitment for the Icon are currently on page 14 of the guidance. The Board recommends they be moved to page 6 alongside the corresponding commitments for Perfexion devices.

Additionally, the Board would like to thank the working group on the expeditious work in completing this guidance document as the Icon Gamma Knife is currently being installed in several licensees at this time.

We appreciate the chance to comment on this subject, and stand ready to answer any questions you may have.
